- 1. Canadian Mental Health Association Grant: \$1,000,000 was granted as part of Ontario's investment to connect up to 328,000 people to primary care teams.
- 2. Hospital Infrastructure Renewal Fund: \$1,849,016 was granted to the Chatham-Kent Health Alliance.
- **3.** Public Health Unit Funding: \$1,077,375 was allocated to the Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit to support our government's work to strengthen public health.
- Ontario Trillium Grant: A project support investment of \$450,000 was granted to provide workshops and one-to-one coaching in Leamington and Kingsville.
- **5. Pediatric Care Funding:** Our government invested \$519,000 in Chatham-Kent to increase access to pediatric services for children and youth.
- **6.** Ontario Trillium Grant: \$66,000 was granted to enhance programs for seniors at the Wheatley Friendship Club to foster social connections, well-being and a sense of belonging.
- 7. Community Emergency Preparedness Grant: \$50,000 was invested in Pelee Island to help our community prepare for and respond to emergencies.
- 8. Interprofessional Primary Care Team Grant: Our government has invested in connecting more people to the health care services they need, locally. \$1,000,000 was dispersed between several primary care teams.
- Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund: \$12,774,602 was dispersed across various areas of Chatham-Kent-Leamington. This funding was allocated for water, wastewater and road infrastructure.

- **14. Southwestern Ontario Development Fund:** \$500,000 was allocated to a local Chatham business to create new employment opportunities and retain 31 jobs.
- **15. Southwestern Ontario Development Fund:** A \$1,598,250 conditional loan was allocated to a local Chatham business to create new employment opportunities and retain 254 jobs.
- **16.** Children's Treatment Centre of Chatham-Kent: \$128,667.61 was granted to the Children's Treatment Centre of Chatham-Kent.
- 17. Family Services: \$19,989.34 was granted to Family Services Kent.
- **18. Counselling:** \$11,890.13 was granted to Rain and Shine Behavioural Counselling Services Ltd.
- **19. Community Living:** \$567,157.13 was granted to Community Living Chatham-Kent.
- 20. Ontario Government announced a \$59 million investment for the new Children's Treatment Centre in Chatham-Kent.
